

Goals of the Community Profile Subcommittees to be considered along with the Visions/Goals list

Economic Development:

- Identify existing available and potentially available property for development and coordinate efforts with planning and zoning project group and ZBA.
- Convert existing zoning to make more properties available.
- Market potential properties for education.
- Use Technical Review Committee to welcome and coordinate new properties.
- Reduce time between Planning Board and completion of new development.
- Bring continuing education to the community.

Traffic & Transportation

- Collect parking study from SNHRPC
- Find ways to do a traffic study of downtown by seeking available grant opportunities.
- Do a safety study to look at lack of sidewalks by seeking available grants.

Leisure & Recreation

- Develop a master link to outline available activities within town groups and with other groups.
- Work with Parks and Rec to expand their site to give other activities not associated directly with the town.
- Create visuals around town to advertise upcoming events, i.e., banners
- Create a town calendar monthly to put in *The Nutfield News*.

Community Center

- Use existing community and senior centers – don't reinvent the wheel.
- Create community by providing information on how to access existing activities (organize existing information) through a database and possibly a website.

Natural Resources

- Beaver Lake Improvement Association Board of Directors had a meeting to hire a consultant (Michelle Trembley) to implement future goals of the BLMP and update the PowerPoint for the plan.
- This summer will approach the Conservation Commission to present the PowerPoint and ask for their support to move the plan forward.
- This fall, they will approach the Planning Board to include the BLMP in the 2010 Master Plan.
- Will approach Pinkerton Academy "stream team" to begin doing water tests Spring/Summer 2010 – may also approach Scouts, 7th & 8th graders at WRBMS and the Pinkerton Environmental Club

Leadership & Communication

- Create a community and volunteer outreach coordinator, but first look at:
 - Vision
 - Job responsibilities
 - Determine whether this is an individual or team of people
 - Determine whether it's a paid or voluntary position – explore grants
- Examine all existing organizations (town, county, state) to make citizens aware of opportunities available through them (maybe through a clearing house that is both in hard copy and via the web).
- Determine who will be potential partners to make this endeavor successful.
